BSA Troop 123 Rules for Successful Participation

1. The proper uniform for Scout meetings is the Class A uniform (Scout shirt, pants, belt and neckerchief). Partial uniforms are not acceptable. No hat is necessary but Scouts may only wear BSA caps at meetings.
2. Scouts must demonstrate "Scout Spirit" as a member of the Troop. Among other things, a Scout may do so by taking a leadership role in Troop activities, acting as a mentor to younger Scouts, and regularly attending Troop meetings and events.
3. Satisfactory attendance (as defined by the Scoutmaster) is a requirement for each promotion in rank.
4. Scout patrols should work out their own transportation to each Troop event. In the event that a patrol is unable to arrange transportation for its members AND there is no excess space available elsewhere in the Troop, adult leaders from the Troop will contact parents for assistance. The Troop has always enjoyed strong parental support. We ask parents to continue to help us by volunteering to transport Scouts as needed.
5. We ask parents to consider the Scout's physical health and condition before providing permission for the Scout to attend Troop events. In the event that a Scout's activities must be restricted or if the Scout is taking any medication, we ask parents to notify the Scoutmaster before the Scout begins to participate in the Troop event. Parents, please bear in mind that adult leaders may not administer medication of any sort to Scouts (except when rendering first aid during an emergency).
6. Troop 123 uses its website <http://www.bsatroop123.org/Home.aspx> as its primary means of providing information to Scouts and their parents. Our calendar, information for events and meetings, permission slips, and other key information are posted to the

website. We ask that Scouts and their parents keep us apprised of your current email address so that we may contact you by email if the need arises.

7. The annual registration fee is \$85 for one Scout, \$160 for families with 2 Scouts, and \$225 for families with 3 Scouts. Scouts may also be asked to pay for their share of the cost of food on trips, transportation fees to defray the cost of transporting Troop and personal equipment to Troop events, and fees for trips. More information will be provided during the year.

8. Parents assistance and support during Troop fundraising is critical. The Troop uses the funds that we receive from these events to support Troop activities. The fundraisers are popcorn sales in fall, wreathes in winter, and car wash in spring. More information will be provided during the year.

9. Adult leaders in the Troop and the Troop Committee are trained volunteers who donate their time for the benefit of the Scouts. We ask Scouts to be courteous to our leaders and support them in their work for the Troop.
